



DELIBERATION

The Electors of the Parish of the Vale have met at the Douzaine Room on this 4th November 2020 for the election of Four Douzeniers and Three Members of the Parochial Cemetery Committee,

The Meeting was opened by the Dean of the Douzaine and Father Tanswell led the opening prayer.

APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE - there were no apologies of absence.

The Dean read the publication regarding the election of the Four Douzeniers and the Senior Constable read the publication regarding the election of the Three Members of the Parochial Cemetery Committee and the other items on the Agenda.

ELECTION OF FOUR DOUZENIERS

As the number of nominations received did not exceed the number of vacancies, and the requirements of the Law being duly observed, the Returning Officer, Miss Rosemary Henry, declared Mr Richard Alan Leale, Mr William Harold Cohu, Mr Garry Collins and Mr André Quevatre re-elected to the office of Douzenier.

THREE MEMBERS FOR THE VALE PAROCHIAL CEMETERY COMMITTEE.

As the nominations did not exceed the number required Miss Rosemary Anne Henry, Mr Kenneth Gerald Carré and Mrs Michelle Juliette Harris were re-elected.

BY THE ELECTORS AND RATEPAYERS

- a) Elected Messrs. Collenette Jones as Auditors for the Constables Accounts for 2020. This was proposed by Mr John Niles and seconded by Mrs Jeanette Guille.
- b) To fix the time at which Parish Meetings shall be held in 2021. It was agreed to start at 7-30p.m.
- c) To take all measures as the Electors and Ratepayers have deemed advisable, viz:
 - Mr Brian de Jersey informed the Meeting that there had been some vandalism to the Cemetery toilets which had caused some fairly serious damage and expense.

- Mr Smithies also informed the Meeting that subsequent to the recent vandalism of the Church and it's property there would be no prosecutions and the matter had been closed by the Police.
- Mr Brian de Jersey also asked if the Hougue Jehannet road was now closed on a temporary or permanent basis. Under the banner of security this road has been closed for some time and all efforts made so far by the Constables and Douzaine had not been productive. The new States are supposed to discuss the possible permanent in due course. The Constables were asked to make further submissions on behalf of the parishioners and Dep. Chris Le Tissier offered what help he could as he is now a member of Home Affairs.

There being no other business the meeting closed at 7.45 p.m. and was followed by the Ecclesiastical Elections run by The Rector and Churchwardens.
